### Comprehensive Navigation Center opens for Whittier's homeless

A 139-bed comprehensive service center was opened in August to serve Whittier residents experiencing homelessness. Wrap-around services provided by The Salvation Army will be offered in a modern residential setting and aims to set residents on a path to self-sufficiency. The center has 78 beds for men, 39 beds for women and can also accommodate up to 10 couples.

Unlike traditional homeless shelters that provide only meals and sleeping accommodations, Whittier's Navigation Center will provide clients with case management services that include health and wellness resources, employment assistance, substance abuse services, and counseling, with the goal of connecting clients to stable income and permanent housing.

"This innovative approach to addressing the needs of unhoused Whittier residents is the culmination of many years' worth of planning and thoughtful decision making by our City Council, The Salvation Army, and cooperating agencies," said Whittier City Manager Brian Saeki.

The Center is just one part of the City's 2018 plan to address homelessness in Whittier, but the COVID-19 crisis prompted the Whittier City Council to vote in April 2020 to speed up the development timeline. While the Uptown Whittier Senior Center served as an immediate answer



City officials cut the ribbon on the newly opened comprehensive service facility and shelter for homeless residents which features 139 beds for individuals in a private space and wrap-around services to its clients that include health and wellness resources, employment assistance, substance abuse services, and counseling with the goal of connecting clients to stable income and permanent housing


to the public health crisis, an all-handson deck approach led to the complete renovation of The Salvation Army's existing building in Whittier which now offers clients a therapy room, patio, and cubicle-style sleeping quarters.

The new Navigation Center will be operated by The Salvation Army, an experienced non-profit service provider with significant experience serving

homeless clients in the Whittier area and across Southern California. In addition to receiving three meals a day and semi-private sleeping quarters equipped with personal hygiene amenities, residents will also have access to transportation, onsite pet care, health services, and free phone service.

The opening of the Navigation

### The Greenleaf Promenade gets green light for extension

The Greenleaf Promenade, created in June, 2020 to allow restaurants and retailers in the Uptown area the opportunity to expand operations outside, will remain in place until February 1, 2022 according to a recent decision by the Whittier City Council. Originally set to be in place until October 15, 2021, which was 120 days past the date when businesses were allowed to be at full capacity indoors, the City Council voted to extend the closure of Greenleaf Avenue between Wardman and Bailey Streets a few more months. The extra time will allow City staff to do further research on public safety and accessibility aspects, as well as options for a hybrid design







Center also allows the City of Whittier to continue enforcement of its no camping, curfew, and other quality of life city ordinances prohibited under the Ninth Circuit's Martin v. City of Boise 2018 ruling. The addition of the Center's 139 new beds is part of the Homeless Action Plan approved by the City Council in 2018, which set a goal of increasing shelter and housing capacity in the City. Criteria for capacity and residency was set forth in a settlement agreement between the City of Whittier and the Orange County Catholic Charities Workers. Per the agreement, the police department has to offer outreach and resources to individuals experiencing homelessness before enforcement action can take place. Having a shelter in the city provides police officers a viable option to offer those they encounter on the street.


According to Police Chief Aviv Bar, the police department handles over 4,000 calls for service yearly about homeless and transient presence. With over 60,000 homeless individuals in Los Angeles County, homeless presence occupies law enforcement time daily in all area cities. Officers can take action when they encounter someone setting up camp (tarp, tent, etc.) and when criminal activity is taking place. Often, officers are called to talk with transients


who are walking with a cart or may be sitting in a park. While outreach is always an option, enforcement is rarely applicable in these instances, explained Chief Bar.


"The navigation center is an important component to the Whittier framework that helps to address homelessness," explained Whittier Consortium for Homelessness President David Gonzalez. "That the project is off the ground and running is an example of community collaboration and a willingness to work together. It's not an easy task or a task that results in perfection, but the court has been clear and working together is the only way to make good things happen. The Consortium is glad to see the Salvation Army once again stepping up to support the community," Gonzalez added.

"Providing a path to self-sufficiency for our most vulnerable citizens while ensuring the safety of our community and improving the quality of life for Whittier residents is a winwin opportunity," said Whittier Mayor Joe Vinatieri.

### Back to School Safety

Back to school time is exciting for many people, from kindergarteners to college students, as well as parents and school staff. Back to school time is also an exciting time for crooks who

exploit unsuspecting victims as streets fill up with students carrying valuables, and school parking lots fill up with vehicles. The following list contains various tips on making your school year a safe one:

- Be sure your child knows his or her home phone number (including area code) address, your work number, the number of another trusted adult, and how to use 911 for emergencies.
- Plan a walking route to school or the bus stop. Choose the most direct way
  with the fewest street crossings. Test the route with your child. Tell him or
  her to stay away from parks, vacant lots, fields, and other places where
  there aren't many people around.
- Teach children whether walking, biking, or riding the bus to school to obey all traffic signals, signs, traffic officers. Remind them to be extra careful in rainy weather.
- Make sure they walk to and from school with others a friend, neighbor, brother, sister.
- When carpooling, drop off and pick up children as close to school as possible. Don't leave until they have entered the school yard or building.
- Teach your child never to talk to strangers or accept rides or gifts from strangers. Remember, a stranger is anyone you or your children doesn't know well or doesn't trust.
- Have a secret code word with your child, to help confirm your child is dealing with a trusted person.
- If your child is home alone for a few hours after school:
- Set up rules for locking doors and windows, answering the door or telephone.
- Talk about what activities your child can and not do while home alone.
- Make sure he or she checks in with you or a neighbor immediately after school
- Agree on rules for inviting friends over and for going to a friend's house when no adult is home.
- Take time to listen carefully to children's fears and feelings about people or
  places that scare them or make them feel uneasy. Tell them to trust their
  instincts. Take complaints about bullies and other concerns seriously.
- Teach you kids to stay alert when they walk to and from school.
- If you park your vehicle at school, make sure the alarm is on, all doors are locked, and all valuables are removed from plain view.

#### 3 Tips for Getting Through Covid Anxiety

Many of us have lots of feelings and thoughts and views around Covid. And whether it has been masks, being closed up inside, or having first hand experience with Covid, the 20-21 years have proven that anxiety does in fact exist. Many people who have never experienced anxiety are suddenly met with the experience of sweating palms, rapid heart beat, sudden irritability, and even racing and unwanted thoughts. Below are a few tips to help you get through everyday Covid Anxiety.

Anxiety tends to be about fear. Usually, and most often, unwanted and unhelpful anxiety is fear about something in the future (i.e. what

could happen, or IF). These following techniques are meant to help you reorient yourself into the present moment and literally shift your brain from functioning in the protective Amygdala of the brain to the logical problem solving Prefrontal Cortex part of the brain. (Note: This article does not replace any medical advice or regular therapeutic treatment under a licensed professional).

5-4-3-2-1 1. The Grounding Technique. This one sounds complicated, but it is actually very simple. Grab an object- a banana for example. First, name 5 things about how this banana looks. Then name 4

things about the way this banana feels in your hands (is it cold? Is it soft? Does it feel ripe? etc) Next we move on to finding 3 descriptive words for the smell of the banana. Name 2 ways in how the banana tastes. And Finallyhow does this banana sound. Ring! Ring! Ring! Banana phone. OK, so bananas don't have a sound, but what does the banana sound like when you put it on the table?

2. The Descriptive Technique. Do you wake up in the middle of the night and have a hard time falling back asleep? Try this one. It's super easy. Pick anything around you- a picture, the floor, or clothes on the floor. Take your time

describing the object in as much detail as possible (in your head). This helps shift your mind back into the realization that it is in the safety of your room.

3. Pressured Breathing. This may be my all time favorite for immediate anxiety relief. Breathe in for a count of 4. Hold your in breath for another count of 4. Release the breath for AT LEAST 6 counts, but preferably 10 counts or longer. Repeat for 3 sets of 3 breaths. Easy Peasey Lemon Squeezy.

This was a rigorous process, and I commend our Board and staff's dedication."

TWC's accreditation was announced by Sen. Bob Archuleta; certificates of recommendation also were presented by Whittier Mayor Pro-Tem Cathy Warner and Council Member Fernando Dutra and by Downey Mayor Pro-Tem Blanca Pacheco.

#### \$1 Million Gift from Golden Rule Community Development Corporation

With a check presentation, TWC acknowledged a \$1 million contribution from the Golden Rule Community Development Corporation (GRCDC). Presented by GRCDC Board president Robert Tapia, Vice President George Muriel and Secretary Vanessa Sedano, the contribution supports TWC's capital campaign to create a new site for its Family Solutions Center and second headquarters. As a legacy gift, the building will be named in honor of GRCDC.

"It will help us create an access center, one where families can come for help with their basic needs and where our TWC programs and co-located partners will help families put together solutions to reach stability. 

California is home to the San Andreas Fault, a dominant earthquake zone. So we must be prepared.

To keep you and your family as safe as possible, we recommend putting together an emergency kit filled with these top 10 essential items.

Ten Items You Should Have In Your **Emergency Earthquake Kit** 

- 1. Water. You will need one gallon of water per each person and per pet for each day, for a minimum of four days.
- 2. Food. Pack non-perishable foods. Do the same for each pet.
- 3. Cash and Important Documents. Pack all insurance papers, medical records/cards, birth certificates, and cash in low currencies to help you in an exchange, or if you need to barter. Pack all paper goods in a zip lock sealable bag to avoid getting wet.
- Clothes. Pack clothes that can be multiuse, such as a light rain jacket, long and short sleeve

- shirts, undergarments and sturdy
- 5. Flashlight. Make sure each person in your household has a flashlight and extra batteries.
- 6. First-Aid Kit. Have a first-aid kit ready for humans and one for
- 7. Medicine. Prescription and overthe-counter medications that you may need if on lifetime prescription or your pets are. Include such items as syringes. You may also want to purchase and store other over-the-counter medicine such as headache and allergy relief medicine.
- 8. Radio. A battery operated radio and extra batteries.
- 9. Toiletries. Soap, diapers, sanitary napkins, toothpaste, toothbrush, trash bags, toilet paper and paper towels.
- 10. Tools. Fire extinguisher, manual can opener, adjustable wrench, sturdy gloves and a whistle.

#### **Additional Earthquake Preparedness Tips**

Keep your car gas tank above half. If there is a widespread power outage, the gasoline pumps will not function. If they do function, the lines might be extremely long, and supply could be low. Having a half full tank will allow you and your family to get away from danger quicker.

Have an out-of-state contact. In a large earthquake, local phone circuits can be overloaded, making it impossible to complete a local phone call. Designate an out-of-state contact for your family members to call and report their status.

Secure large objects. Secure shelves to the wall studs and keep heavy objects on the lower shelves. Fasten heavy frames and mirrors to the wall. Secure your water heater by strapping it to the wall studs and bolting to the floor.

Purchase a gas and water shutoff tool. You can purchase a gas/water shutoff tool at a hardware store. Place this tool next to your gas meter. Southern California Gas Company recommends you turn off your gas meter if you smell gas, hear gas leaking or see other signs of a leak—as long as it is safe to do so! You can use the same tool to shut off the water main if any water pipes are broken and leaking.



#### How to find the right employee

Over the past several months, many small businesses have experienced tremendous difficulty finding and hiring part-time or full-time talent. There are many reasons as to why individuals aren't motivated to return to work or start a job for the first time, but there are a variety of ways businesses can attract individuals who do want to work, now.

As a business owner with seemingly too much on your plate, you might think you don't have time to write a job description that describes the vision of your company and what it is like to work there. But put yourself in the place of the candidate: they want to know what you believe in and what it's like to work for you. They want to get a "feel" for the place, and not just a clinical list of responsibilities and qualifications. They want to get a sense of your personality and of the company culture.

With this in mind, a recommendation is for you to include the following (or some variation) in your job descriptions:

A short description of what the company does, and what kinds of benefits your products or services offer your customers. "We're a pop and rock music school that teaches our students how to love playing their instruments and how to perform live, on-stage, in front of an audience."

A brief description of the company culture. "We are a small team, operating very much as a family. We work incredibly hard but also value a healthy work/life balance... etc."

A job title that makes sense and is easily understood. If you're looking for a receptionist who will assist with administrative/office support tasks, then say it. Don't feel you have to create a fancy, indecipherable title like "Customer Relationship Experience Manager."

A short narrative that describes the position, while directly addressing the candidate. "As the 'Receptionist & Office Administrator' you will be using your strong communication and organization skills to work directly with our customers and connect them with the right trainers... etc."

A brief idea of what the candidate's day will be like. "On any given day, you will be balancing your time between answering phones,

scheduling client appointments with trainers, answering email enquiries on our website about our products and services, and posting upcoming events on our website and social media accounts."

Address the candidate directly about what qualifications/experience you would like them to have. "You have a Bachelor's degree in any field, but it will be especially helpful if you have strong written and verbal communication skills. You enjoy speaking in front of large groups and are comfortable maintaining a presence on Social Media. You are proficient in Microsoft Office Suite, especially with Word, Excel and PowerPoint... etc. "

A brief description of any training that is offered, along with the prospects of growth development. "This is an entry level position that will allow you to grow as a member of our team. You will be trained on how to use our products and services and how to use our proprietary scheduling software. Ideally, after you have had the opportunity to excel in this position, you will be trained to be a Client Service Rep."

A general description of compensation and benefits. "You will start off working 20 hours per week, and after 60 days of training, if you are happy and excelling in the position, you will become a full-time employee with a terrific benefits package. Compensation is very competitive, and we look forward to discussing this with you when we meet you..." etc. [Or, you could list the actual hourly dollar amount you are offering.]

Clearly explain the application process. "To apply, please send us your resume and a cover letter telling us why you are interested in the position. Send all correspondence to Josephine Smith at jsmith@emailaddress.com.


Sign off with a positive message. "We look forward to hearing from you!"

There are a million ways to write job descriptions, but if you take the time to focus on delivering a description of your company that truly reflects who you are and what it's like to work on your team, you will inspire qualified candidates to apply for the gig.


